The City of Seattle is rebuilding Seattle's central waterfront. Now that the Alaskan Way Viaduct removal is complete, the City is constructing a park promenade along the water, building a new surface street along Alaskan Way, rebuilding Pier 58 and Pier 62, building an elevated connection from Pike Place Market to the waterfront, and improving east-west connections between downtown and Elliott Bay. This effort, called Waterfront Seattle, is a \$728M, multi-year investment between now and 2024. It is led by the City of Seattle's Office of the Waterfront and Civic Projects.

BRING YOUR MASK. POV NO LONGER NEEDED

As stated previously, we will be following the guidelines of local jurisdictions—in this case the City of Seattle, King County and Washington State.

The governors of California, Oregon and Washington have announced a lifting of the indoor mask mandate as of March 12th. King County as also announced that they will lift the mandate on March 12th. What does this mean:

- » Masks will not be mandated at the Seattle Asian Art Museum. Please keep in mind that we will be meeting in a large space with lots of ventilation and space for social distancing. I know some of us will continue to wear masks in large groups and we encourage everyone to make choices for their own safety and comfort.
- » Masks are required in all public transit and ride shares or taxis.
- » Individual businesses can elect to require mask wearing, so please come with plenty of masks on hand
